Webalo User Proxy boosts SOA, Web services

Eyeing SOA deployments, [Webalo](#) on Tuesday unveiled a Web service called "User Proxy," which is intended to provide a consistent user interface across Web services regardless of the device being used.

Acting as a mediator between Web services and the end user, the software provides a proxy for end user interface devices such as PDA phones and notebook computers. Users are able to have a continuous "always on" presence, in which User Proxy accepts information from an offline user and then interacts with the user later.

Through the User Proxy, an application can write to a "super device" and then reconcile formatting of the application's data and the device protocols to match the device being used at the moment.

User Proxy also features a dashboard-type approach to the interface itself and how it should react to changing circumstances. Integrator developers can implement SOA applications with device-independent interfaces.
